We will think about animals suited to the cold weather and think about their homes. We will learn about different cultures as part of our Chinese New Year theme. Our Space theme will help us to understand the solar system and how our world is part of something bigger. Don't forget to look out for the Target reading books online as well as the reading book your child brings home.✓ Please ensure you sign the reading record each time you read at home.✓ Please make sure your child's book comes to school every day so that we can read with the children regularly and change books each week.
