# Stone Farm Study Centre – where and why?

- Traditional working farm in Bridestowe, Devon
- Beautiful setting, in the foothills of Dartmoor on the edge of the National Park
- Owned and run by ex-teachers who understand children!
- Good accommodation and excellent meals
- Lots of animals to enjoy (and help look after!)
- Plenty of space to run around, and things to do indoors if the weather is unkind to us
- Lots of terrific educational places to visit nearby









### Accommodation

- Two buildings Farmhouse and Applestone
- Smallest room sleeps 4, the largest sleeps 12
- Wash, shower and toilet facilities are close at hand
- Children have a say in who they share a room with
- Staff rooms in each building





#### Meals

- All meals are provided (with the exception of a packed lunch on the first day)
- Choice of breakfast each morning, with a cooked option
- Packed lunch (Wednesday Friday)
- Evening dinner with two or three options each day
- Vegetarian and special diets catered for
- Your children will not starve!





# Just a few other things to mention

- Insurance is included in the cost
- A kit list will be sent in March
  Important: Old and comfortable, not designer and cool!!
- Children must not bring valuables, jewellery or mobile phones on the visit



#### Kit List

- Sleeping Bag or covered duvet
- Pillowcase and single sheet (a pillow is provided)
- Named Wellington Boots (essential, we are staying on a farm!)
- Long socks
- A waterproof with hood and waterproof trousers (if you have them)
- Trainers for outdoors (old ones are best)
- Slippers for indoors
- 2 Pairs of old trousers e.g. jogging bottoms and jeans
- Sufficient changes of underwear, socks etc.
- Warm jumper
- Warm coat/jacket
- 4 T-shirts/shirts or blouses
- Large Towel
- Small rucksack or day bag
- Woolly Hat, gloves and scarf
- Suncream and hat
- Disposable Camera
- Wash bag
- Bin liner for Dirty Washing
- Named Purse or Wallet
- List of clothes to help with packing to return home





### Payment



- Total cost per child will be £270. This includes travel, accommodation, meals, insurance and entrance fees.
- £70 deposit is required by Friday 5th December
- The balance of £200 should be paid by Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March, either in a lump sum any time before that date, or in instalments.
- Contact school if you want to discuss your personal financial situation; you may be eligible to apply for financial support for the trip.
