

Science - Forces


History – Victorians

Introductions-Asking questions such as 'What is your name?' and replying in French, learning how to say how old we are.

Counting-Learning how to count to 29.

Computing

- We will start this term by learning how to code a Microbit. Each child will have their own Microbit and will work through a selection of challenges. Microsoft MakeCode for micro:bit
- We will also be learning how to interrogate a database as well as creating our own.

R.E. – Pilgrimage

The children will be thinking about special journeys which they have been on before thinking about what pilgrimages mean to people of Christian, Muslim and Jewish faiths.

P.S.H.E. - Goals and Dreams

We will look at dream lifestyles, jobs and careers, the dreams and goals of young people in other cultures, how we can support each other and rallying support to meet aspirations of ourselves and others.


English – Novels and explanation

We will be reading the book 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty together as a class and doing lots of exciting work based on it. Skills we will be focusing on include:



- Making **predictions** based on what they have read.
- Writing from different points of view.
- Factual descriptions using information from the story.
- Analysing a text.
- Using **persuasion**, including writing a persuasive argument.
- Writing in the style of the author.

We will also be continuing to develop our spelling. punctuation and grammar understanding in SPaG lessons.

Maths

This term we will be looking at:

- **Fractions** including fractions of an amount, equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering fractions and multiplying fractions.
- Shape both 2D and 3D as well as shape transitions and translations.
- More **complex worded problems** that involve two or more steps to find the solution.
- We will also be continuing with our weekly arithmetic and times table work.

By now your child should know their Education City log in, but if they don't, please encourage them to ask their teacher for a reminder.
