Our Themes this Term	Communication and Language
<p>Superheroes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Special people in our community who help us. • How have these roles changed through history? • What are our super powers? <p>Daily phonics sessions include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognising sounds (look out on Tapestry for which sounds we are learning each week) • Reading words and sentences • Letter formation • Segmenting words for spelling 	<p>This term our number work will include all numbers to 10. We will practice recognising the numbers in different representations, writing them, and ordering them. We will find ways to make the numbers and practice adding and subtracting.</p> <p>We will be measuring length, height and time and exploring 3D shapes.</p>
Understanding the World	Expressive Arts and Design
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will look at special people in our community and think about the roles those people carry out. • We will find out how these special jobs have changed over time. • We will spend lots of time in our outdoor environment, looking at changes that happen in Spring. • We will find out how Easter is celebrated around the world. 	<p>Our main project at the start of term will be to design and create superhero capes. We will then be looking at how colours can reflect emotions. We will do some observational drawings of spring flowers and will create some Easter craft. We will continue to use songs and music as part of our daily routine and will use drama to retell stories.</p>

Reading Reminders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Please make sure you read with your child at least 3 times a week – we really notice the children getting this support from home, they make much quicker progress in their reading. ✓ Please ensure you sign the reading record each time you read at home. ✓ Please make sure your child's book comes to school every day so that we can read with the children regularly and change books each week. ✓ The words we are learning this term are: we, he, she, be, me, my, you, they, are all, was, her.
PE	Our PE day is Friday. Please make sure your child has a PE kit in school. The bag and everything in it must be named please!
Forest School	We are very excited that Forest School will continue this term. Please make sure you send your child in warm, old clothes on their day and be prepared for them to need a bath when they get home! The children need a bag of spare clothes to change into after Forest School as they are often very wet and muddy.
