



English

- Write diary entries focussing on writing with empathy from a character's viewpoint
- Act out scenes from the book
- Hold a debate around one of the events in the story
- Practise persuasive sentences which we will then use for letter writing



Maths

- 8s, 6s and 7s times tables
- Multiply three 1-digit numbers
- Understand that multiplication is
 commutative (can be done in any order) eg
 5 x 3 x 6 = 6 x 5 x 3
- Calculate area by counting squares and link this to arrays and multiplication facts
